Child Injury Prevention: an overview of the 12 most frequent foreign bodies in 0-14 years old children




COINS Most frequent in >3 yrs old

Incidents occur while playing Retrieved in digestive system Presenting with cough, dyspnea and wheezing Complicated in stenosis, pneumonia





PIN & NEEDLES Most frequent in >3 yrs old Occur in everyday activities Interest trachea lungs and digestive tract Presenting with pain, bleeding, cough Can lead to severe complications, like lacerations pneumotorax and infections Immediate referral to the doctor



NUTS & SEEDS Most frequent in >1 year old Incidents occur while eating Retrieved in aerodigestive system Presenting with cough, dyspnea, cyanosis Complicated in pneumonia, infection



PEARLS, BALLS AND MARBLE Most frequent in >3 yrs old Incidents occur while playing Elective location nose, ears and digestive system Presenting with pain, bleeding, inflammation and dyspnea Complicated in perforation, infection

PLASTIC

Most frequent in >3 yrs old Incidents occur while playing and eating Retrieved in trachea, bronchi and digestive system

Presenting with cough, dyspnea, cyanosis Complicated in pneumonia, respiratory arrest, perforation and laceration



PEBBLE Most frequent in >3 yrs old Incidents occur while playing, in ears and nose or they can be ingested Presenting with pain, odor, purulent discharge Can end in infection and perforation



**STATIONERY** Most frequent in > 3 yrs Incidents occur while playing



TOYS All ages interested Incidents occur while playing Retrieved in ears, nose, trachea and bronchi Presenting with cough, dyspnea, cyanosis, bleeding, pain Complicated in pneumonia, infection, laceration



### BONES

Most frequent in >3 yrs old Incidents occur while eating Elective location pharynx and larynx Presenting with cough, pain, dysphagia



#### PAPER

Most frequent in >1 year old Incidents occur while playing Preferred locations ears and nose, bronchi Fine-grained paper more dangerous Presenting with cough, pain, discharge, bleeding Can end with infection, perforation, pneumonia



Retrieved in ears, nose and tracheobronchial tree

Presenting with cough, dyspnea, cyanosis Complicated in pneumonia, infection, perforation



## BATTERIES

Most frequent in > 3 yrs old Introduced in nose and ears, while playing Presenting with discharge, pain, bleeding Severe complications when ingested Lead to necrosis, perforation and infection Immediate referral to the doctor

JEWELLERY Most frequent in > 3 yrs old All location extremely risky Incidents happen while playing Presenting with pain, bleeding, Complicated in perforation, laceration, infection Immediate referral to the doctor
