



Biostatistics, Epidemiology and Public Health at the University of Padova in Italy developed a short survey to collect specific information on the consequences of the pandemic on cases of foreign body injury in children, in order to be able to collect useful information on the procedures used, strategies implemented and difficulties that have emerged in the last year.

Medical practice has undergone a profound upheaval: the virus has forced to change relations with patients and adopt specific
